1788	Founding of Unity Meeting House on Potneck Road
1800	Congregation moved to log structure on 12 acres of land thought to have been owned by the Trott family at current location, Woodleaf-Barber Road
1847	Present sanctuary built
1874	First manse built north of the church
1928	Manse built in Woodleaf
1932-1933	Sunday School classrooms added to the back of the sanctuary
1953-1954	Fellowship Hall, kitchen, bathrooms, and Sunday School rooms added
1963	Present manse built
2011	Addition of 6,000 square feet completed, including Fellowship Hall, kitchen, bathrooms, furnishings, landscaping
2013	225th Year Anniversary of founding of Unity Church
